## *A Special Address by Chief Guest*

Respected dignitaries on the dais, Principal Dr. Archana Narahari, esteemed faculty members of ILSASS, CVM University and most significantly my dear students, let me begin by congratulating you all on this wonderful occasion of the 15th Annual Day Function of your dear institution and wish you and your institution the very best in the coming years. It is a profound honour and gives me immense pleasure to stand here before you to speak to you about a topic that is not only close to my heart but of tremendous significance for the world we live in today. I commend the institute and its faculty and board members for choosing to focalize this important area of thought and work that is, 'gender sensitization'.

I often feel that before we talk about sensitization we could start talking about disabusing ourselves of the prejudices and biases that we accumulate as we grow up from childhood to adulthood and in that process we would already acquire sensitivity towards gender. Children are born the same, all human, with their own wonderful individual personalities and without the need to shame or harm and yet as we grow up into adulthood we have somewhere along the way created for ourselves roadblocks and obstacles to the growth, prosperity and opportunities of girls, women and persons of minority genders. If we start very early on, at our homes, at our educational spaces and in our basic civic responsibilities to include an attitude of respect for gender minorities, we would no longer need to be trained in adulthood towards sensitization. We have to foster an attitude of inclusivity and tolerance for difference in children, in society at a very early age and that would go a long way in ensuring that we do not live in a gender unjust society.

I could think of several anecdotes of gender imbalance such as violence toward women and girls, male child preference, forced reproduction, acid burning, dowry harassment, domestic violence and subtle everyday microviolences that women and girls face to illustrate my point. I decided however, to go with a simple incident from my life as a parent to a nine year old girl. One of these evenings my daughter went down to play with her building friends who were a mix of girls and boys. They were playing a game of pretend play where they all wanted to be something they are not. Surprisingly or perhaps not so surprisingly, most of the girls decided to be princesses and the boys decided to be knights or soldiers. Further, their notions of what a princess looked like and what soldiers looked like was also a stereotype. The girls thought that princesses had no power in governance or agency in the future; that they were mere tools of beauty and the beauty itself a rather limited notion of long dresses, high heels, flowing tresses and glittering crowns. The boys could not conceive of being princesses, as though being of another gender, even in pretend play



was an insult and they could not think beyond violence to define themselves. No soldiers of love and peace, no knights who may be helping the poor and not brandishing swords or guns and no princesses who may be riding a horse or steering a ship in pants. My daughter was confused and decided not to gender-identify at all because the choices were limiting and problematic for her. So she decided to be a dragon. The children were very surprised, even laughed and thought that she was deviating by not desiring what they had been socialized into viewing as completely natural.

One of the girls said to my daughter that her mother tells her that girls are “born to be beautiful”. But is there any truth to any of these stereotypes? A dragon was perhaps a girl or not but certainly a creature of ferocity, imagination, flight, fire and power. My daughter wanted not to be defined by biology but rather choose her own identity. Truth is, there is nothing remotely natural about those choices the children were making. Nobody is born wanting to kill, dominate or look conventionally pretty. Most babies are exactly the same. They wish to eat, drink, play, they are curious about the world and want to be able to stand, walk and talk as soon as possible. Once language enters the picture of course, politics and culture also enter the picture. Jaques Lacan and Julia Kristeva have shown us how the mirror stage is one where language creates gender identity. In a patriarchal society we raise our boys to be brave and girls to be quiet, beautiful and dainty and the way we speak to them socializes them into the same. We often equip boys with the language of domination, such as “I am a winner” making them believe that they can do anything and we often cripple our daughters by making them believe that being ‘good’ or ‘good-looking’ or well behaved or nurturing is more important than winning or being loud with words such as “little doll” or “meri gudiya”. It is popular culture and the market, that soon inundate our lives with images of what girls ought to desire and what boys ought to desire that begins to school and socialise the young into gender roles that society desires rather than what they truly desire for themselves. Even a simple phrase such as “all men are born equal”, places men first!

Early on, girls are taught, if not directly then through subtle choices, words and messages, that they are objects of control and pleasure and boys are taught that they will lose their masculinity if they show emotion or do anything that society perceives as feminine such as cooking, nurturing or artistic. Today we realise that this has many ramifications for the empowerment of women and girls as it leaves them forced to do excessive labour and endure violence at the cost of their sense of self and aspirations, for their well-being and safety and also for the safety and well-being of men and boys. Just as young women will be forced to give up on their dreams of becoming astronauts, writers, scientists and athletes (or dragons) under the pressure of good behavior, marriage, child-birth, lack of safe spaces and limited mobility or lack of access to good medical care for mental and physical health, these lies about who women and men or girls and boys truly are also leaves men beleaguered. They buckle under the pressure of being sole bread winners, of not being fully able to express themselves emotionally and of not being able to embrace their softer, caring and artistic sides fully. Men are often taught that if they are emotionally expressive then they are probably not manly enough. This may be the root cause of several health issues, for bottled up emotions and inauthentic lives can cause both mental and physical breakdown. In a power laden society this also means that they unleash their frustrations on those who are more vulnerable than them, often women and children in their lives. Perhaps if boys were allowed to cry without judgement they would learn to be softer and kinder to others and learn that emotions are not necessarily weakness but rather a deep kind of enduring strength.

Funny thing is, if we look deeply we realise that in spite of misplaced mass opinion, women and men have always dared to be different and that has often brought with it tre-



mendous powerful change and enrichment. Queen Elizabeth I of England went from not being accepted as a female monarch to being one of the longest-ruling monarchs of Europe under whom the English empire and the great renaissance thrived and flourished. Princesses and queens have often looked less like the Disney versions who are damsels needing to be rescued and more like Rani of Jhansi who valiantly fought the colonisers, with her son tied to her back sword in hand, or like Queen Boudicca who led the Britons against Roman oppressors who raped and flogged her and her daughters after the death of her husband or the Egyptian queens Cleopatra or Hatshepsut who reigned supreme, assuming male roles and the latter going on to become a pharaoh of Egypt taking her people to a long reign of peace and prosperity. If girls are going to be princesses, then why not think about who princesses truly are? If you know the princess and the pea story, I will add another anecdote. In the fable the princess was found out because she was used to such luxury that a pea underneath her pile of soft mattress made her unable to sleep at night. I say, we rewrite these patriarchal stories. If you truly want to test whether someone is a princess, I tell young children often, give them a crown and a scepter and see how they govern their kingdom.

So, imagine a society where gender or biology does not determine what you can achieve, how you may dress, what names you may be called, how crime against you may be perceived and how much money you make and how far you go in life? Such a society is possible if we understand that gender is a spectrum of biological differences that must be respected and not discriminated against. We must work together to create a society where women and men are not pitted as against each other in a match but seen as equal, as equally human and humanity itself a rainbow of genders and races, not a homogenized monolith. Language is the most critical element in the formation of such a society and identity and if we can interrogate and unravel language to see the gender-based prejudices or biases embedded in language itself, we can understand the role discourse plays in creating stereotypes, injustices and imbalances. Philosopher Judith Butler has argued that from the moment we are born, language produces us as male and female by the declaration, 'it's a boy' or 'it's a girl'. What if we were to rewrite what it means to be marked as 'girl' or 'boy' so that confronting adversity stoically is not necessarily called "manning up" but rather "womaning up" or not tell a boy child to "stop crying like a girl" and ask them why it is they are crying and help them to face their emotions so it is not projected or transferred to violence or not absolve boys or men of accountability in crime against women by saying "boys will be boys" and when girls are loud, clumsy, funny, brave or ambitious, we start qualifying those traits not as tomboyish or aggressive but simply as "girls will be girls"?

Literature is a place for stories and the more stories we hear about the varied ways in which women and men can lead their lives, sans judgement, the more voices of others that we pay attention to through multiple stories we know that how a single privileged man or community feels about itself or about how things ought to be in this world is insufficient. Stories enable empathy with other voices and hence usher in inclusivity; they remind us that our stories are not the only stories and everyone needs to be heard and everyone needs to be provided with the same opportunities. If all the philosophers are straight white men, then we must rework the syllabus to include the incredible women, LGBTQI and non-gender identifying philosophers around the world and in our own country to recognize that philosophy has no gender. Neither does cooking or child-rearing. Gender equality does not mean erasure of gender difference but rather inclusion, respect and celebration of difference. Let us work together to visibilise women and girls, let us listen to each other and believe women and girls when they narrate their truths just the way we believe men and boys.
